IS THIS YOUR ORGANIZATION???

If YOU are a property owner on Sinissippi Lake, including the area between the dams at Hustisford and at Horicon, the Lake Sinissippi Association is Your organization . . . and if you DON'T BELONG you SHOULD . . . and HERE'S WHY!!!

In the spring of 1944 there was an excessive drawing down of the water level and it was a fairly normal spring . . . by early June the level had dropped so much that in many places on the EAST shore there was as much as EIGHTY (80) feet of dry, lake bottom . . . THEN came the Association, there had been none for some years . . . organized by a group of 25 dedicated Sinissippians a "Committee to Save Sinissippi" was formed and the name was subsequently changed to its present title. In July, 1946, the Association was duly incorporated as a non-profit corporation under laws of Wisconsin.

At the start, the Association tackled many problems that had been impairing the property owners values, such as a disparaging attempt to keep the lake known as the Hustisford Pond, or, even less flattering, Mud Lake. Upon a petition to the U. S. and Wisconsin Geographic Boards, the name Sinissippi Lake was officially accepted in 1946 and highway maps, etc. were then correctly labeled.

There has been a constant chain of letters between the Association, the Hustisford Electric Utility and the Conservation Department as to the proper manipulation of the dams so that the usually summer time low level could be raised. The Utility made a verbal gentlemen's agreement with the Association and would draw no water for its wheel between Decoration Day and Labor Day. However, the Conservation Department was adamant in allowing any kind of a flow from its wild game refuge in the Horicon marsh and it took years more to gain any ground there. However, never again and despite some dry summers, lack of rain, that the shoreline ever showed up in footage again.

In 1952 the owners of property below the Hustisford dam petitioned for a Hearing on new regulations for the Hustisford dam to prevent, as they claimed, spring flooding. The Association opposed the petition and while their opposition failed to win, they did succeed in having an elevation set for summer time operation that would place the mark at at least seven (7) inches above the crest before the gates could be opened. After the draw down of the lake in 1972 with eventual restoration in 1973 the Association will positively pursue this Order to its satisfaction

In 1945 the Association celebrated the 100th anniversary of the lake. (In which year, 1845, John Hustis built a grist mill and dam, the latter formed Sinissippi Lake). The big attraction for this important anniversary was a Wisconsin Championship Outboard and Marathon regatta. This was so popular and so important in bringing a reputation to the lake as an ideal place for such recreation, that it was more than a pond, but an excellent body of water, that races were held each year thereafter through 1955 when the sponsorship of such races was dropped, it being felt that the event had served its purpose and was no longer desirable. The 1955 races with over 125 drivers was one of the largest outboard regattas ever held in Wisconsin and an estimated thousand people were in attendance.

The Association recognizes all the problems that exist, the shallow depth of water, the silty bottom, weeds in the bays, lack of game fish (since 1936 when the Horicon Dam was closed for the first time after which conditions for spawning were obliterated, and after 1939 when the new dam was built at Hustisford which stopped the migration of many game fish from the lower river, the fish could no longer jump the dam as they did previously). Collection of garbage and rubbish has also become a major factor. The gravel, narrow and sometimes impassable roads of the past have been eliminated and replaced in many cases by wider and paved roads, much of the effort for so doing came from Association. Pollution has always been fought against and many complaints have been filed against such pollution in Dead Creek, the lake's main tributary, the cannery at Horicon, industrial pollution wherever existant. Formation of a single or several sanitary districts has long been advocated by the Association, these districts would have budgetary power to control many of these conditions.

Some years ago the Association acquired a weed cutter to try and eliminate some of the conditions of weed growth. However, the expense of operation and lack of man power and payment for such service, has curtailed this operation. The Board will delve further into this problem once the lake is restored in 1973 after which a more extensive growth of weeds is anticipated.

For the annual dues not all things can be done on the spot as there just aren't the funds for them. However, the Association delves into every problem, has secured a greater cooperation from the Town Boards than ever before and will continue to fight for a better lake at all times. The tax situation has been constantly a matter of discussion and your feelings on this are known to them.

Every property owner on the lake or on the river should belong. It is not fair that a group of people, few or many, should carry the load for all. As close to 100% membership is essential for a greater success. Problems that affect the many, a constant satisfactory water level, how to better and beautify your lake, to eradicate pollution, weeds, algae, all these require concerted action. Dedicated men, your officers, who spend much time and effort without thought of compensation should be appreciated. Personal differences should never enter the Association. There is a Board of 15 men elected by members to serve them who, too differ in opinions, in desires and aims, but they make an all out effort to serve you. The small yearly dues barely cover the cost of operation, mailing and legal fees. Don't expect miracles but the answers they can find and give you. If you don't belong, or if you have let your membership lapse, is it asking too much that you join now . . . for a solid front in the unknown days ahead so we face our problems . . . together with a solid, united membership.

Join today. It is your organization.

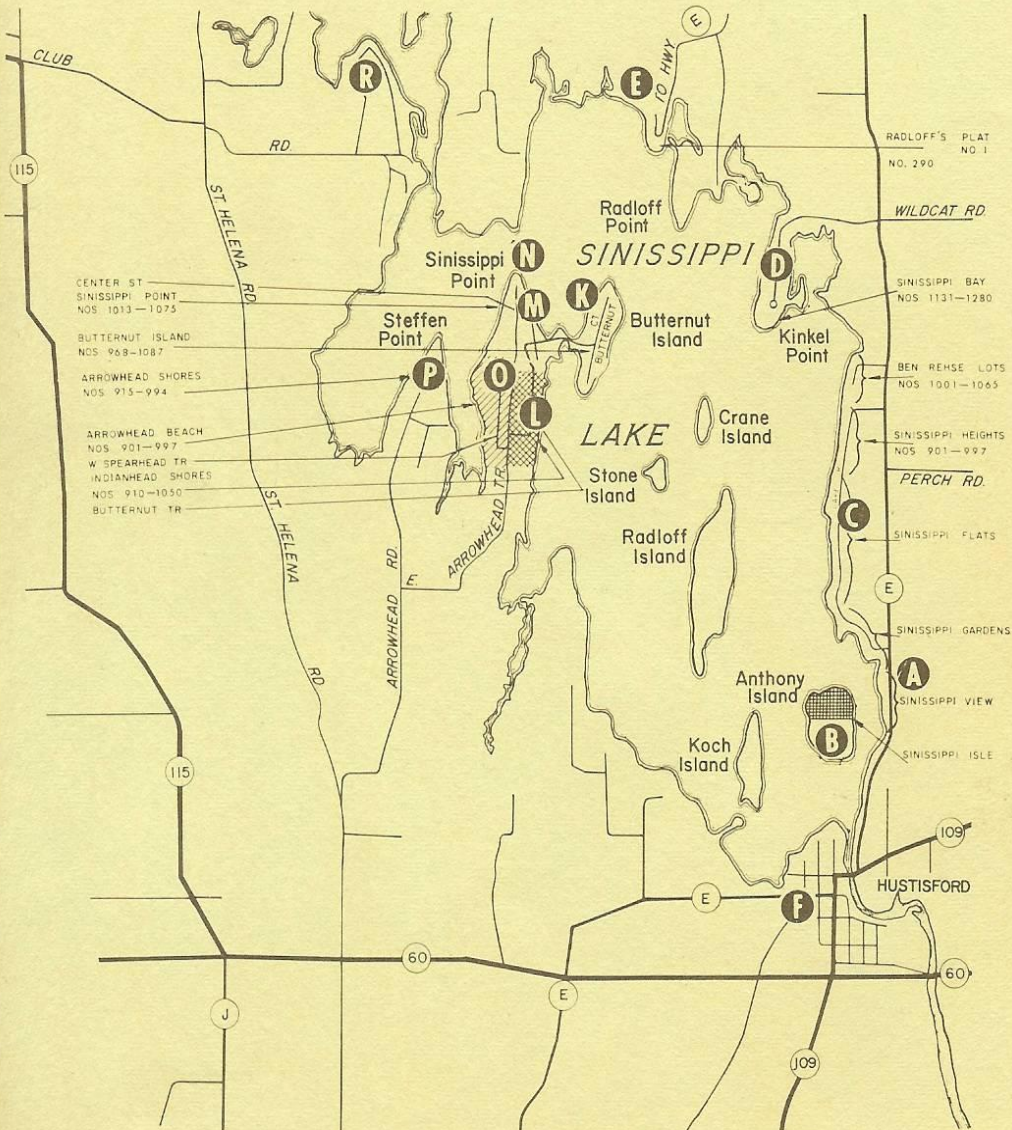
APPROX. AREA - 2000 ACRES
